



SOLID WASTE Q & A



Q. Why did the Town of Enfield go to a four day Trash and Recycling pickup schedule?

A. This has been put into effect to reduce our costs during these difficult times.

Q. Where can I find out when my collection day is for Trash and Recycling?

A. You can view this by visiting <http://enfield-ct.gov/content/91/169/4317/2108.aspx> or call our Solid Waste Division at 763-7560.

Q. On weeks when there is a holiday what happens to my pickup schedule?

A. Collection days prior to the holiday, are not effected. If your day is on or after, you will be delayed one day. During all holiday weeks there will be **NO Yard** Waste pick-up. You can also view Solid Waste's Holiday schedule at the above mentioned link.

Q. Why did the Town purchase two new refuse trucks?

A. The new truck, pictured to the right, makes the Solid Waste operations more efficient and reduces the risk of injury to employees.



Q. Why does the barrel need to face a certain direction and is there a reason there need to be two feet between containers?

A. The barrel needs to be facing the street with the arrow pointing towards the road so when the mechanical arm places the barrel down the lid will close. There needs to be room in between so the arm can reach around the containers.



Q. What is the Town of Enfield's goal pertaining to recycling?

A. The Town would like to exceed the State mandate of 54% by 2014. We are currently at 24%

Q. Why is recycling so important?

A. As of May 31st the Town of Enfield has recycled 2,259 tons, resulting in a savings of \$187,612.


Summer Carnival Thursday, August 6, 2009
