

Emergency Operation Center Information Sheet

Overview

The Town of Enfield has established an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in the Enfield Police Department. An EOC is the physical location where an organization comes together during an emergency to coordinate response and recovery actions and resources. The process involved a group effort by those individuals that are members of the EOC and Town Departments involved in providing the infrastructure for the center. The Information Technology Departments involvement included wiring the room with enough voice and data ports, populating the room with a ceiling mounted projector, a computerized white board, cable and television and a sound system.



When EOC team members are gathered in an emergency, the functionality of the multimedia room is important to provide the highest level of communication. Each location is equipped with voice and data connections. Each location has its own phone number and the data port is live so a Town computer or laptop can be connected and provided with resources associated with the user's logon credentials. The information can be projected onto the computerized whiteboard with sound from the speaker system from each locations VGA/sound connection to the projector, and individuals can interact with the whiteboard for a more efficient means of communicating information. A television is also available for viewing valuable news information from any cable channel. The television sound can also be provided over the speaker system by switching to that source.
