## OUR PROGRAMS

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**Adult & Community Services offers a variety of programs to families, if interested in any of them please call us for more information or appointments at (860) 253-6395.**

**Energy Assistance:** Helps to pay for your primary heat source. It is available to all income eligible families and individuals regardless of your heating source. You could still qualify even if your heat is included in your rent. The income guidelines vary according to family size. Please call CRT (860) 560-2694 to schedule your appointment with the CRT Case-worker in our office.

**Clothing Assistance:** If you are having a hard time making ends meet we can help you clothe you and your children. We offer vouchers to various clothing closets as well as the Salvation Army. You must be a client or willing to bring in Birth Certificates, Social Security Cards, income, and proof of residency.

**Back to School:** We accept donations of school supplies and new backpacks to be distributed to children of our clients for the start of the new school year. If you would like to make a donation or if your child needs a new back pack and school supplies please contact us. Our supplies are extremely limited and they are distributed on a first come first serve basis. To qualify you must be a client currently on our programs. We recommend calling in early August for the sign up list.

**Christmas Adopt-A-Family:** Every year we match people who are looking to help out a family with a family who can use assistance for the holiday season. A sponsor is a person or group of people who adopt a family for the holidays. If you decide to participate you will be given a wish list from the children. If you are looking to be adopted for the holidays, we recommend calling in October or early November we are limited to the number of sponsors we receive. You MUST be a current client. We generally give out the applications when you apply for Energy Assistance.

**Enfield Board of Education – Reduced cost or free lunches:** Income guidelines apply, ask for an application to fill out from your child's school.

**WIC:** WIC is a supplemental nutrition and education program. Supplemental means that the formula or food WIC provides may not meet your food needs for the month. Some WIC benefits include: milk, cheese, eggs and other healthy foods. Must meet income guidelines and be either pregnant or have children under the age of 5. Must go to the WIC office to apply, 50 Chapman Place, Room 5, East Hartford, CT 06108. To be seen in Enfield, you must call 860-528-1458 to schedule your monthly check in.
